Released on Earth Day, the latest Thrive annual report reveals an exciting new announcement: the accomplishment of another action item!

FA:1A was accomplished thanks to the City partnering the Indy Local Grocers Coalition to invest nearly \$300K at ILGC affiliates to accept SNAP benefits. These stores are primarily in low food-access areas, aiding affordable access to healthy food.

To date, this brings our total number of accomplished items up to **eight.**

CSA stands for **Community Supported Agriculture**. In short, it's a weekly subscription box of locally grown food.

Growing Places Indy is currently accepting new members into their CSA. Membership includes 12 weeks (June-August) of a variety of vegetables, fruits, and herbs sustainably grown on their farm.

Produce changes on a weekly basis and one share generally supplies a family of 3-4 for a week. Members are responsible for picking up their boxes.
